





Applying the Lessons of #MeToo and Time's Up:
How We Can Combat Sexual Harassment

Three Presentations



Presenter: Harini Srinivasan, Associate, Katz, Marshall & Banks



Harini Srinivasan's presentation was educational, timely and compelling. As a civil rights attorney, her introduction was related to her work in sexual harassment. Her experience added credibility to the topic and build-trust to capture the audience attention and interest.

After her introduction she covered these topics: (1) A Brief History of MeToo and Time's Up, (2) How has the national spotlight on the issue manifested in the workplace? (3) Federal and State Policies and Laws Against Sexual Harassment, and (4) What Can We Do?



In closing, she shared: "The #MeToo and Time's Up movements have forced society to see the gaps between the promises of our politicians and lawmakers and the realities of individuals... Title VII and state laws exist to prevent and remedy sexual harassment, but they are remedies that often come into play after the damage has been done. Sometimes the law pushes forward society, but even more often, society pushes forward the law. We are in the midst of an exceptional moment in the women's movement and we can capitalize on that moment by being kinder to each other, being better advocates and being more knowledgeable about our rights. With the law and the public combined, we can make sure that our workplaces engage the talent and ability of millions of American women."

After Harini's presentation, upon reflecting upon her bio's statement below, her passion to become a civil rights attorney was clearer: *"I became a lawyer to help workers who courageously step forward to stand against abuse in their workplaces and pursue justice by challenging their employers' unlawful actions."*

She won the door prize book: *Reckoning Day: #MeToo Stories That Inspire You* by Dawn Jamison


